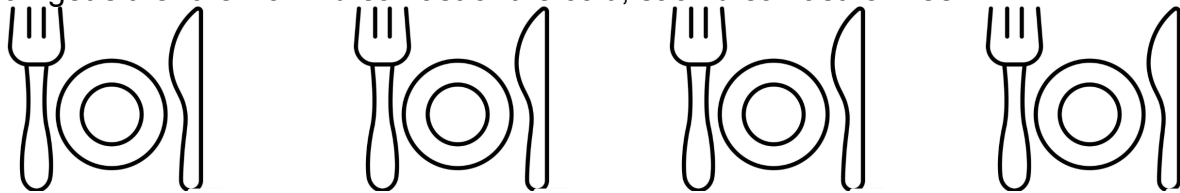

School Improvement Goal 1 - 2023-2024

By June 2024, OBJ students will move from a 2022-23 score of 29.6% to a score of 40% or higher of students demonstrating a level three or level four on the Smarter Balanced Assessment of English Language Arts standards.

- Students will choose best fit books, by interest and skill level
- Students will read books during ELA and outside of their ELA class
- Students will learn about different genres of books
- Students will talk about their books with each other and adults
- Students will apply their knowledge and skills to their choice book
- Students will use sentence starters and sentence frames to discuss their books



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School Improvement Goal 2 - 2023-2024

From September 2023 through June 2024, Oakland Bay Junior High in-school and out-of-school exclusions will be 60 or less, or two-thirds of the 91 exclusions in 2022-23. As of 11.13.23 there have been 4 suspensions.

- Teachers will clearly articulate and engage in discussion with students around the building-wide student expectations
- Teachers will review expectations after breaks and as needed based on student behavior
- Teachers will use building-wide strategies to correct student behavior
- Teachers will teach students de-escalation and problem solving strategies
- Teachers will develop a community in their classrooms based on acceptance, communication, and celebrations
